

Ethical Standards for School Counselors in India

Purpose

The primary objectives of these ethical standards are to:

- Establish a comprehensive framework for ethical practices that aligns with the professional expectations for school counselors in India.
- Provide structured support for self-assessment, peer consultation, and performance appraisal concerning school counselors' multifaceted responsibilities toward students, parents/guardians, colleagues, school administration, and the broader community.
- Act as a reference for all educational stakeholders, including students, parents/guardians, educators, administrators, community members, and legal professionals, regarding the ethical standards, professional values, and expected conduct of school counseling professionals.

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Core Ethical Principles

1. **Respect for Individual Dignity:** School counselors must honor the inherent dignity of every student, offering respect and support irrespective of socio-economic status, religion, caste, gender, abilities, or family circumstances.
2. **Commitment to Equity and Inclusion:** Ensure equitable access to a robust school counseling program that addresses academic, career, and social/emotional development, with a particular focus on supporting students from historically marginalized and underrepresented communities.
3. **Confidentiality and Privacy:** Adhere strictly to confidentiality guidelines, disclosing student information only when legally mandated or when it is essential to prevent imminent harm to the student or others.
4. **Competence and Professional Development:** Engage in lifelong learning and professional development to maintain and enhance counseling skills, remaining informed about emerging trends and evidence-based practices in the field of school counseling.
5. **Cultural Sensitivity and Responsiveness:** Demonstrate a deep understanding of and respect for the diverse cultural, linguistic, and religious backgrounds of students and their families, ensuring culturally appropriate counseling practices.
6. **Advocacy and Systemic Change:** Advocate for students' educational rights, well-being, and access to necessary resources, and collaborate in creating policies and practices that promote an inclusive and supportive educational environment.

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Responsibilities to Students

- Establish a safe and nurturing environment where students feel free to express themselves without fear of judgment or reprisal.
- Facilitate students' academic, career, and personal/social development through the use of proven, evidence-based counseling techniques.
- Identify and address systemic barriers to educational equity and student well-being through advocacy and systemic change initiatives.
- Refrain from imposing personal, religious, or cultural beliefs on students, maintaining an unbiased and supportive counseling approach.

Confidentiality and Informed Consent

- Clearly communicate the nature, purpose, and limits of confidentiality to students and parents/guardians, utilizing accessible and comprehensible language.
- Obtain informed consent from students and their parents/guardians prior to sharing sensitive information with school staff, external professionals, or agencies.
- Ensure that all student records, whether physical or digital, are stored securely and shared only with authorized personnel following established legal and ethical guidelines.
